Absorb isocyanate with suitable absorbent material (see § 40 CFR, sections 260, 264 and 265 for further information).

Shovel into open container.

Spill area can be decontaminated with the following recom-

mended decontamination solution:

Mixture of 90 % water, 5-8 % household ammonia, 2-5 %

detergent.

Wash down spill area with decontamination solution. Allow solution to stand for at least 10 minutes.

Pick up with suitable absorbent material.

Place into appropriately labeled waste containers.

Move container to a well-ventilated area (outside).

Allow to stand for at least 48 hours to allow escape of evolved


